### CONFERENCE OVERVIEW

The twentieth Annual Conference of the North American Association of Summer Sessions is being held at the International Hotel in New Orleans, Louisiana. The University of New Orleans and St. Mary's Dominican College are to be the institutional co-hosts of this year's meeting, represented by Bill Dees (University of New Orleans) and Carl Drichta and Jean Ferriot (St. Mary's Dominican College).

A pre-conference **Workshop for Newer Summer Sessions Administrators** will be conducted on Wednesday, November 2, from 1:00 to 9:00 p.m. Melvin Bernstein, Administrative Dean for Summer Programs at the University of Maryland-College Park, will direct the Workshop, assisted by Marilyn K. Brown, Director of Institutional Studies, University of Maryland, and Alton L. Taylor, Director of Summer Sessions at the University of Virginia. The purpose of this program is to provide newer summer administrators with a framework within which they may succeed as administrators in higher education. The Workshop is NAASS's attempt to provide quality summer experiences for our students. We urge all newer deans and directors to take advantage of this service.

The theme for the 1983 Conference, **Bourbon STREET Exchange–Summer** • **Training • Renewal • Education • Enrichment • Technology**, was selected due to the interest in improving summer school management through the use of today's technology. Summer school directors are always seeking new and better ways to increase their efficiency as administrators.

The **Opening Conference Luncheon** will feature the winners of this year's Creative and Innovative awards. The winners of the credit and non-credit areas will make short presentations following the welcome, invocation, and presentation of the awards.

Immediately following the luncheon, Leslie J. Coyne of Indiana University and Sid Eder of Lewis and Clark College will discuss the most pressing problems facing summer deans and directors in both large university and small college settings. The participants will then separate into two groups where administrators can deal with these specific problems based upon institutional size. After a short break, the participants will hear Christopher Weir of Emerson College make a presentation on the **Demographic and Economic Pitfalls of Higher Education**.

### CONFERENCE OVERVIEW (continued)

On Friday morning four regional vice presidents will host a breakfast for their respective constituents. See the program for Friday, November 4, at 7:30 a.m. for those regions holding breakfasts and the room locations.

Also on Friday, the **Third Plenary Session** will involve a presentation on the statistical study of colleges and universities within NAASS by John W. Schmidt of the University of Wisconsin at Oshkosh. This will be followed by several small-group discussions, including the very popular **Catalog Clinic**.

On the final day of the Conference, participants will hear William Noyes of the University of Arizona discuss how he has utilized the computer in the administration of summer sessions at his institution. After a short break, will will return to hear Leroy Tuscher, Director of Educational Technology at Lehigh University, speak on the topic: **Impact of Information Technology in Higher Education**.

A feature of this year's Conference will again be the **NAASS Hospitality Room**, located in the Baccarat 9 Lounge on the second floor of the hotel. Here individuals and small groups may meet informally at their pleasure. This area also serves as the registration and message center for the Conference. In addition, each Regional Vice President has at his or her disposal an area for their respective regional members to congregate on a casual basis in the evenings. Please feel free to join with these groups—the experience can be stimulating.
