Conference Registration—Please complete the enclosed Conference Registration Form and send it, along with the appropriate fees, **no later than October 18, 1985**. All fees paid, less \$10.00, are refundable if the registration is cancelled before October 28, 1985. The Registration Fee includes: (1) the Sunday President's Reception, (2) the Monday Regional Continental Breakfast and Conference Awards Luncheon, (3) the Tuesday Conference Reception and Banquet, and (4) the Wednesday Buffet Breakfast.

Additional Tickets—Additional tickets for spouses (spice?) or guests are available for all non-meeting functions. The fees for all activities are to be found on the Conference Registration Form.

Hotel Reservations—A postage-paid room reservation card has been included in your registration materials. Please note that the final date for receipt of hotel reservations is **Thursday, October 3, 1985**. If you require assistance with your reservation, call the Biltmore Plaza Hotel Reservation Service at (401) 421-0700. Room deposits are refundable if cancelled 24 hours in advance of the scheduled arrival date.

If you are planning to drive to the meeting, the Biltmore Plaza provides free parking for all hotel guests.

Ground Transportation—

From Greene Airport (Warwick, Rhode Island):

- (1) The Biltmore Plaza provides a free airport van
- (2) The Airport Limousine Company provides service to the hotel at a cost of \$5.75
- (3) Cabs are available at a cost of \$16.00

The duration of the ride from the airport is approximately 25 minutes.

From Boston:

The Bonanza Bus Line offers direct service from either the downtown Greyhound Bus Terminal or from Logan Airport. In either case, the traveler will arrive at the Providence Bus Terminal, located immediately behind the Biltmore Plaza Hotel. Current round-trip fare is \$15.00 from either location.

- (1) From downtown the buses depart the Greyhound Bus Terminal every hour-on-the-hour. The trip takes one hour.
- (2) From Logan Airport the buses depart every hour-on-the-half-hour. The trip takes approximately 85 minutes.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Weather—The parade of cyclonic storms which march across New England defies description. To be on the safe side, pack your "London Fog," an umbrella, and a muffler.

Shopping—The Biltmore Plaza Hotel is located in the downtown Providence area, which provides the normal urban retail store selection. Of special interest, however, are the following two complexes.

The Arcade is the country's oldest indoor shopping center. It is registered as a National Historic Landmark and located just two blocks from our hotel. (See the brochure, *Providence Welcomes You*.)

Our visit will conclude at 4:30 p.m., at which time we will board the buses for the return trip to Providence. Cost is \$12.00 per person.
